Description of the program

The Security Studies program aims to provide a range of modules that will form the basis of information and advanced knowledge in the field of security studies aimed at training students to basic professions related to this field by providing solid specific and systematic knowledge on institutes and concepts security systems and on their situation and prospects in the region and world.

Career

Description of courses

Core courses

- **Criminal Material Law**
Basis for teaching in this course is the general and specific part of the Criminal. In this course, instead of the traditional method ex cathedra, actively will be implemented the case study method and clinical methods.
- **Criminology**
The acquisition of advanced knowledge on the object of study of Criminology and its main institutions, issues and contemporary trends and studying the influence of various factors in the commission of offenses, criminological examinations on the perpetrator and victim of crime and identification and criminological analysis of contemporary issues.
- **Criminalistics**

Specialization in this area is needed especially for the professional who will work in the justice - court, public prosecutor and judicial police. Criminalistics at its core has substantive and procedural criminal legislation and regulations derived from them. Each figure includes legal offense in itself determine the totality of facts and circumstances relevant to the overall right solution of the criminal case.

- **Master Thesis**

This module enables students to transfer their skills and knowledge to research and make more complex task of Master-Thesis. The module is designed to be fully practical and students to acquire the necessary knowledge and skills to approach writing the thesis. The module has unique return result-to enable students to write the master thesis with minimal difficulties, and with maximum efficiency. The course aims to improve research techniques and style of writing paper, taking account to stop illegal means, such as plagiarism and infringement of copyright, which are prohibited by the Statute of SEEU.

Elective courses

- **Misdemeanor Law**

The aim of the course consists in gaining advanced knowledge on the right of offenses as scientific discipline as well as part of its substantive and procedural, including regulating legal under the law for minor offenses.

- **Criminalistic Methods**

Criminalistics methodology is a special part of criminalistics tactics which examines and identifies the ways and methods to detect specific types or groups of crimes and their perpetrators. This discipline also examines the differences that are manifested in the investigations of various crimes. In this course, students will learn about the methods of investigation and identification of some crimes such as crimes of murder, trafficking, terrorist acts, traffic accidents, corruption, war crimes, etc.

- **Victimology**

Victim issues, the process of victimization, increasing the number of people who are victimized, victim compensation and the prevention of victimization are key issues of the case, because the protection of victims and victimization represent a major preoccupation of modern society.

- **Penology**

The acquisition of advanced knowledge on the subject of study of Penology and its main institutions, issues and contemporary trends and studying the influence of various factors in the execution of criminal sanctions, penological examination regarding the punishment imposed as well as identifying and analyzing penological contemporary issues.

- **Criminal Procedural Law**

The purpose of this course is for students to gain a solid theoretical and practical knowledge of criminal procedural provisions and institutions which is legally regulated and the activity of the procedural authorities and other participants in criminal proceedings and prepared for their practical application.

- **Juvenile Delinquency**

Juvenile criminals are in close connection with other phenomena of socio-pathological, such as drug addiction, alcoholism and prostitution, phenomena that are distributed today in almost every country in the world, and unfortunately they are present in our country. Therefore, the purpose of this discipline is to discover and record new forms of this criminal phenomenon and to explain the reasons for their presence in order to propose appropriate measures for their prevention and repression.

- **Juvenile Comparative Criminal Law**

The course examines criminal systems against children in different countries, through a systematic analysis of criminal law solutions in the context of their harmonization with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.

- **Organized Crime**

Organized crime, as a new discipline examines the forms, causes and measures to prevent and combat all types and areas. Particular importance is given to theories of organized crime, criminal organizations and forms of its manifestation.

- **Criminalistic Techniques and Tactics**

Specialization in this area is needed especially for the professional who will work in the justice-court, public prosecutor and judicial police. Criminalistics at its core has substantive and procedural criminal legislation and regulations derived from them. Each figure includes legal offense in itself determine the totality of facts and circumstances relevant to the overall right solution of the criminal case.

- **Criminalistic Psychology**

This discipline has character to support other criminal law sciences in order to assess the psychological truth and falsehood in the criminal trial against the defendants, witnesses and other persons in criminal proceedings through psychological assessment of their statements and actions.

- **Computer Crime**

Students will gain advanced knowledge on new types of crimes that are performed by computers and internet networks and modern ways of preventing it, which is highly developed in today's digital society. Will be analyzed crimes such as computer fraud, counterfeiting of software, and other forms of internet abuse for criminal purposes. Will analyze the international and national legislation in order to gain solid knowledge on standards and global trends in this subject.

- **Ethics in Criminalistics**

Ethics in Criminalistics is part of the general ethics that examines the question of how with the preventive and repressive measures to protect the community from crime professionally and efficiently, while respecting the constitutional and legal principles of freedom and human rights of the citizens. This subject is important because police work is treated as a profession and ethics and ethical standards play a major role in the way of practicing.

- **Police Law**

Police Law examines police administrative law dealing with domestic affairs. It is defined as a set of legal rules that define the organization, functions and organs of internal affairs, mutual relations and relations with other authorities, organizations, citizens and special procedures and working methods in the field of internal affairs, when performing administrative work that does not belong to any other branch of administration. Police Law studies: citizenship, the supervision and protection of state borders, general security affairs for the safety of persons and property, police work, public gatherings, travel documents, foreigners, police functions, principles of conducting powers police, police organization and functioning in the RM, organization and powers of the Ministry of Interior, private asylum and protection. In this case through a systematic approach and interdisciplinary study of advanced theoretical aspects and practical law enforcement police tactics and modern methods in the application of police powers to achieve efficient and effective function of police in modern society, and control over the police.

- **Rhetoric**

During its long history of 2,500 years, rhetoric was used to indicate many different things; but rhetoric nowadays is considered as the art of persuasion through language. Rhetoric marks the way that an individual is linked to a particular theme or idea in order to convince the others. Rhetoric is characterized by several distinguishing features.

- **Multilingualism and Multiculturalism**

The purpose of this subject will be multilingualism in multicultural societies as a social phenomenon. This phenomenon is massive in the world. During the lectures, more precise terms such as monoculturalism and multiculturalism will be considered. The term 'linguistic nationalism' has at least two forms of this nationalism, which collide with each other: for the leaders of the most powerful countries nationalism means expansion, and for minorities it takes the form of defiance and struggle for the affirmation of identity, despite such pressure. The emphasis during the program will be multiculturalism in education. In the schools curricula consists of contents from different cultures.

- **IT Applications for Preparing a Scientific Paper**

The aim of this subject is: - To display the technical elements, the structure of the text and design of a scientific research. - To enable students to acquire advanced knowledge and skills from selected advanced chapters of IT applications that will be needed in preparing the scientific and research paper. - Practical application of these objectives in preparing student's individual research paper.

- **Professional Communication**

The course is focused on the development of those communication skills that are essential for effective functioning in the professional world. Students will study the process for analysis of different communication situations, and will accordingly comprehend them. Among the themes that will be covered are communication in organization,

interpersonal and group communication, oral presentations, interviews for employment, professional business letters and interpersonal skills including group dynamics and teamwork.

- **Project Management**

On successful completion of the course, students will be able to: - plan the activities necessary to implement the project, identify their interdependencies, their duration and costs; - prepare the necessary reports and perform all the required communication between the project and the client, as well as among the team members and the other stakeholders. - structure the project to its constituent activities; - prepare a Gantt-chart and a network plan for the project and identify the shortest time needed to complete the project; - use MS Project as a tool in the process of planning, implementation and review of the project; - define the project, identify its scope and objectives and develop project specification;

- **Optimization Methods**

The aim of this course is to present techniques of modeling and optimization in order to prepare students for developing their ability to prepare models for solving real problems in the field of computer science. The course explore the importance of matrix factorizations as an important tool which offers modality for optimizing the solutions of different numerical algorithms which are of basic interest for problem solving in the area computer sciences. The course introduces optimization theory and approach to find the optimum. The different methods of optimization will be analyzed such as the simplex method, duality problem and sensitivity of the problems of linear programming. The aim is to explore a computer implementation for each of the problems followed by the proposal of the corresponding model for optimization.

- **Ethical and Legal Issues in Information Technology (IT)**

Aims of the course program: - to develop an understanding of the relationship between computing, technological change, society and the law; - to emphasize the powerful role that computers and computer professionals play in a technological society; - to provide an understanding of legal areas which are relevant to the discipline of computing; - to provide an understanding of ethical concepts that are important to computer users and professionals; - to provide experience in the consideration of ethical matters and the resolution of ethical dilemmas.

- **Protection of Human Rights**

The purpose of this course is: to introduce students with the concept of international law on human rights, their implementation, influence of those rights in the creation of national policies; to encourage students to critically reflect on the relationship between international law and national law; make them aware of current international events, how they affect the daily lives of people in the world; encourage students to contribute in matters of drafting laws for the protection of human rights hoping that, the law makers will consult them same during the creation and implementation of state policies.
